This 24/7-access language learning tool offers encouragement to keep you going when other language software becomes complicated. It's simple to set up and easy

TLO is a great tool to try a new language, brush up before a big trip, or expand vocabulary. There is a searchable phrasebook, real-time Twitter examples of vocab usage, and audio examples of native pronunciation (that you can slow down to catch everything). It offers pronunciation practice, interactive games, and proficiency tests.
