

Thirteen-year-old DJ wants nothing more than to compete as a show jumper in the Olympics. After years of training, only one thing stands in her way—she doesn't have a horse! Other titles in the "High Hurdles" series: DJ's Challenge and Setting the Pace. For ages 11–14

In 1864, when his family moves to Bellfield, Minnesota, where his father will be the town minister, twelve-year-old Ben misses his friend Zack, who is now a drummer in the Union Army. He finds a new friend in an orphan whose parents were killed during a Native American raid. The "Ben and Zack" series also includes Captured by a Spy and Union Army Black.

Thirteen-year-old Abby Kendall and her family set sail for Hawaii in the year 1847. Abby and her stowaway friend, Luke, find exciting adventures and discover that God is faithful to his promises. This is the first in the series of "Abby: Lost at Sea." For ages 8–12 J/PB/Walls
