### **Programs**

**Katie Stringwell** led the asynchronous Community Book Haunt program, which invited participants to use a coloring sheet of a home to share where in their home they had "haunted" (read) during the month of October. Over 80 children returned their coloring sheets.

**Gloria Walsh-Rock** says, "We had a number of classrooms submit Short and Scary contest entries, swelling participation to 84 entries, our largest yet. Thanks to FOL for sponsoring the gift certificates for the winners."

#### School, Scouts, & Community Outreach

**Heather Forster Jensen** has met with reading specialists and library staff from both Immaculate Conception and Conrad Fischer to begin re-strengthening our relationship with Elmhurst schools after the disruption caused by COVID-19. She was able to share about the various collections we have in the department that support the students' learning opportunities.

**Nuala Maloney-Murphy** and **Linnea Dolan** have continued to welcome back Scout troops, and provided a program for a Cadette group on October 14, for a Lion group on October 21, and for a Junior group on October 28, serving a



total of 49 scouts. Linnea says the Junior scouts "loved learning to use a Cricut to add ghosts, bats, and skeletons to their Halloween banners" and the Lion Scouts "had a great time planning their buttons, drawing them, adding the different pieces, and putting the whole thing together."


#### **Inside Scoop:** Friends of the Library




