Wonder About Your Water? Exhibit

The traveling exhibit, which has since moved on to it's next destination, encourages community members to think about the ways they use their water and how we can all work together to protect our water supply. It explores water as a valuable and limited resource, and covers water use, conservation and the three watersheds of DuPage County. The exhibit itself was also created out of recycled materials.









Outreach




