


One Book, One Elmhurst: Remarkably Bright Creatures

KIDS' LIBRARY DEPT REPORT

September 2024

Programming

Fall storytimes have started again. Romp & Rhyme continues to be a big hit with a full attendance, a pop-up storytime in the Learning Garden for the overflow, and a drop-in playtime called Romp & Rhyme After Hours in the programming room. To tie in with the One Book, One Community book, our hidden stuffie is a pacific octopus. We also put together a cart of octo-mania activities and books. Another school year of homeschool programs began with an experiment of how many rubberbands it takes to explode a watermelon (answer: 808)! Meet a Firefighter was a huge hit with the storytime crowd—more than 100 people attended. The T-Trak train group brought their train display and around 250 people enjoyed the large display set up in the Kids Library. Our second Dig in to Play: Toddler Sensory Time was just as popular as the first, so the next one will be held in Meeting Room A to more comfortably manage the crowd.







Collection and Displays

The Teacher Technology Collection is in the process of being updated. Heather, Katie, Fiona, and Michael created a wish list of items, which are being ordered in two phases. Phase 1 included STEM Bins, Learn & Play Packs, transparent X-ray images of animals and insects for our existing light boards, magnetic force science lab kits, critical thinking games, and updated storage supplies to more efficiently organize, store, travel with, and check out the materials. As part of the update, the collection's scope is being expanded to include more than just technology.

As a tie-in with *Little People, Big Dreams* Day on September 21, **Heather Forster Jensen** created a mobile display and pop-up program with biographies, coloring sheets, and activity pages. Kids who stopped by the desk to share their hero or a big dream received a special vinyl sticker sheet from the publisher. (Not surprisingly, Taylor Swift and Caitlin Clark were both mentioned.) To keep this program focused primarily toward early to midelementary students, the cart was rolled out after school on the weekdays leading up to September 21 and remained in the Kids' Library throughout the weekend.



Following the success of last year's passive Library Sign Up Card Month program, **Kelsey Wilcoxon** re-created the giant library card prop for kids to pose with. **Michael Speers** improved the process by utilizing an iPad app that would send a picture directly to the Kids' Reference email account, so we didn't have to get the digital camera and then upload the pictures to print them. The quality was much better, and kids could see us print and hang their pictures right away.



Outreach

The library's relationship with District 205 continues to flourish. The fall *District 205 Community Connections* newsletter will feature Elmhurst Public Library, specifically the first grade World of Books field trip developed by the Elementary School Coordinator **Heather Forster Jensen**. A physical copy of the newsletter is sent to all taxpayers in Elmhurst, in addition to its digital sharing to D205 families and through social media. Throughout October, D205 will be collecting footage in order to create the article and accompanying video.

Patron Interactions

A patron came in and stated that her preschool-age granddaughter was struggling with managing her frustration and anger. **Brianne Rigitano** assisted her in finding an array of picture books, non-fiction, and parenting materials on helping children with emotions. About a week or so later, she came back in and thanked us saying that the books had been very helpful for her and her granddaughter.




Embroidery Instruction

This young patron is proudly displaying her new "plant pals," custom decorated animals made as ornaments for house plants. She's one of dozens who participated in September's drop-in craft.




Being a Good Neighbor
