Director's Report

- Repairs to the lobby elevator are complete. An inspector came out last week and gave us the green light for operation. The elevator was out of service for over a month, which was a minor inconvenience to patrons. During that time, patrons used the elevator in the Kids' Department. People were very understanding but it's good to have the lobby elevator operating again.
- It's Winter Reading time again and Adults can participate in a winter reading challenge to expand their reading comfort zone, while high schoolers can participate in a program to earn prizes for reading. The kids' theme is Reading is Sweet and prizes are earned after completing 20 days of reading and 40 days of reading.
- On Martin Luther King Day, patrons can participate in a day of service by participating in handson activities focused around the theme of creating warmth. The community-building event takes place in the Large Meeting Room and people of all ages and abilities are invited to attend.



Entertainment Station



Monthly Stats


Month over month, the number of Makery visitors trended upwards. As usual, the peaks occurred in the Summer and in December. The December peak was relatively lower this year than last year.

December was once again one the busiest monthts of the year in the Makery. Lots of families come in for activities while the kids are off school and many more come in to make gifts.




Equipment Reservation Stats
