DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Staff displayed DIY projects in the basement at our inaugural Maker Faire. It was inspiring to see all the interesting things that people produced. We even had one of our Board Members, Sue Sadowski, participate by showcasing her tissue paper-wrapped candles. Another staff Maker Faire will be held in the beginning of February to encourage more staff members (and Board Members) to get excited about the maker movement. It's wonderful to be able to check out a sewing machine or an item from the Culinary Cupboard to tap into that creative side that exists in all of us.

The Kids' Library started a new campaign called "1,000 Books Before Kindergarten." The 1,000 Books campaign encourages caregivers to read 1,000 books to their child before they enter kindergarten. The program promotes early literacy and child bonding. When the 1,000-book goal is reached, readers earn a prize and an invitation to a graduation party.

The One Book, One Community initiative will be introduced in the winter copy of *Fine Print*. Patrons choose from six titles picked by staff for their readability, quality, and potential to inspire thought-provoking discussion. I think this will be a great community program, hopefully sparking conversation among friends and neighbors about topics that promote learning and understanding.
