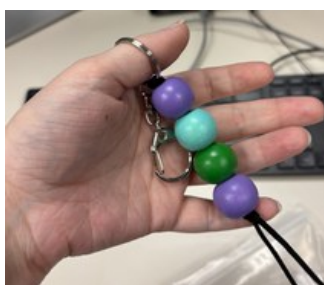


## Clues & Brews (left)

The many colors of April included being green for Earth Day, throwing colors for Holi, making Sensory bottles during Family Sensory Hour, balancing on colorful stepping stones as part of Dig Into Play, and partaking of engaging book displays.

Nearly 350 children voted for their favorite way to help the environment. Turning off the lights won with 113 votes, followed by walking or biking with 89 votes, recycling with 84 votes, and planting with 58 votes.



Nearly 100 people attended the Holi Celebration. The presenter provided some background on the holiday, taught the audience two dances, read *Festival of Colors*, and led them through a movement/storytelling activity. Everyone had a great time during the color throwing outside as well.



Three families (8 people total) attended the before-hours Family Sensory Hour. The therapy group from Northshore Pediatrics helped the kids make sensory bottles. Everyone seemed to enjoy using the library and they were pretty self-sufficient!

Twenty-four people participated Dig Into Play sensory activities. The toddlers had fun playing with kinetic sand, splashing in the water bins, playing musical instruments, and walking on the colorful balancing stones.





## Displays

April displays included a variety of fun topics and interactive elements: Zoo Animals, April Shower, Artsy April, and Arab American Heritage Month. A patron let us know how excited she was to see the Arab American Heritage Month display. She said this kind of display was something she hadn't seen often in other libraries. She was happy to see the diversity and picked a book to read to the child while she was here.



## Outreach

In lieu of “Spring Into Reading” booklists and videos for grades K-1, 2-3, and 4-5, this year the Elementary School Coordinator created [Monarch](#) and [Bluestem](#) Nominee Preview videos for the newly announced 2026 titles, which she shared before spring break. There was positive feedback almost immediately from two D205 librarians:

- Erin Howe, Jefferson: *“Thank you so much for creating these! They are great!”*
- Peg DeYoung, Fischer: *“This is a fabulous gift. Thank you so much! [...] If you are making a cool Caudill video to go along with the Monarch and Bluestem ones, I'd love to see it!”*



In preparation for summer, Kids’ staff visited Hawthorne, Jackson, Visitation, Salt Creek, and Emerson schools to talk about the reading program. The elementary school visits began with a rousing game of “Who Would Win?” with popular game characters. Not surprisingly Steve from Minecraft was the hands-down winner, but students also enjoyed getting to see “old school” characters such as the Hungry, Hungry Hippo and the Candyland game piece.

## Middle School Happenings

Since Angela Caringella began as the Middle School Coordinator in December, attendance at the Middle School Influencers group has slowly increased each month from 2 to 5 to 7 attendees this month. Interest in the summer volunteer opportunities has also been strong with the Library having to cap applications at 100.

## April 26: I-Pass on Demand

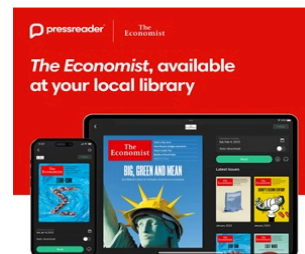

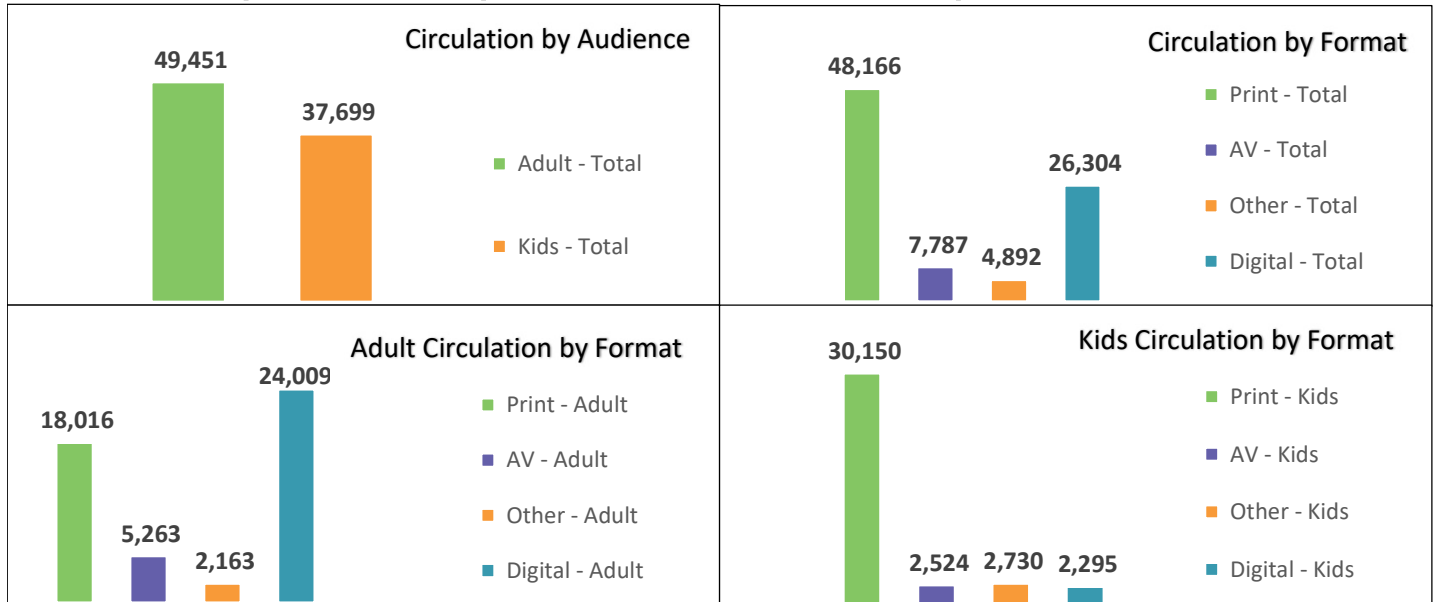

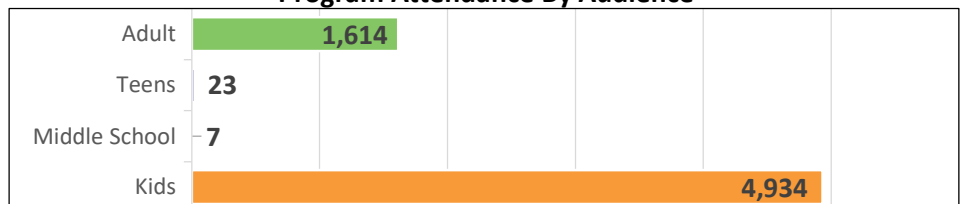
