#### **DIRECTOR'S REPORT**




#### Collection

Summer booktalk titles by the numbers:

- 75% of the titles were still checked out at the end of the Summer Reading Program.
- Total number of checkouts for 572 copies was 1870.
- Average checkouts per copy 3.27
- 12 titles had an average of 4 or more circs per copy

Varying the number of copies based on the genre worked well. We ordered more copies of graphic novels and funny books and fewer copies of non-fiction and historical fiction titles. Both the most and least popular books were from the middle school selections. The most popular title was the graphic novel *Swing* by Audrey Meeker and least popular was *Dropping Beats* by Nathanael Lessore.





# **Middle School Happenings**

The End-of-Summer Volunteer Party had 22 attendees. The volunteers had a great time playing board games and Nintendo Switch and eating pizza! Those who could not attend were contacted to pick up goodie bags as a thank you for their work. Thirteen Middle School Influencers attended the August session. They played "Who am I?" where everyone wrote a person/character on a post it and had to answer yes or no questions to try to find out who they were. 


**Staff Training on New Equipment**
