DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Checkout statistics were up three percent from March 2015. Digital materials, alternative collections and electronic device checkouts continue to remain strong. Umbrella checkouts were also popular this month thanks to all the rain!

We'll be adding two new items to the collection very soon. Patrons will be able to check out GoPro cameras and Launchpads. Launchpads are a new product offered by Playaway. We already have several hundred Playaway audio books in our collection. Playaway's new product, the Launchpad, is a pre-loaded tablet with games and apps for teens and adults. Because we plan to continue to expand alternative collections, staff decided to give the collection a name. We are calling it the Library of Extraordinary Things. Look for a special article in the next Fine Print letting patrons know about all the fun things they can check out at EPL.

Several staff members attended the Public Library Association (PLA) Conference in Denver this month. They came back very excited and infused with new energy. The PLA conference is geared exclusively to Public Libraries with programs and exhibits that are on trend. The conference takes place every two years and we usually send two to three people.
