Staff were also given a chance to shop the event. Afterwards, remaining items were donated.

The Marketing Department has taken other measures to support the SCARCE presentation on being green from this year's Staff Institute Day. Molly Schlecht, our Graphic Designer, has started a staff-wide initiative to collect pop top tabs for recycling. Carol Pavlik, our Communications Specialist, recently started sending out the biweekly staff newsletter digitally, instead of paper copies, too!

#### **Mystery Library**

This pop-up display idea came out of the interdepartmental Marketing Committee. The idea behind it is to connect reader to titles they may not pick out themselves. Selectors from Kids, Teen, and Adult Services chose a total of sixty-four titles. Circulation then changed their status to Display and worked with volunteers to wrap the books and label them with Genre, Age Group, Format, and other interest factors (such as: Award Winner or Oprah Book Club Pick.) Within three days the display was picked over, with fifty-three books getting checked out. This pop-up effort was coordinated by Marketing staff, and given a boost with digital marketing through our social media channels and our eNewsletter.


Amenity: Library Pets!
