DIRECTOR'S REPORT

It's wonderful to be open with no time restrictions. Patrons are especially happy about having access to the study rooms. We are receiving requests for in-person programming and patrons are also interested in meeting rooms. Because Fine Print is produced so far in advance, most of the summer programs are still virtual. However, we will host some outdoor programs and will also offer pop-up programming in the summer to bridge the gap until fall programming begins.

We're also planning to open up meeting room reservations again. The parking lot resurfacing project is complicating things because we are going to relocate the drive-up to the west entrance and will use the meeting room hallway for our drive-up holds staging area. The Gathering Room is available and we hope to begin scheduling it soon based on reduced capacity rates.

We are still planning for the parking lot resurfacing to begin on May 17 but everything is contingent upon the weather. More details will be presented at the meeting.

ADULT SERVICES DEPARTMENT REPORT April 2021

Staffing Changes

We're beginning the transition away from remote work and the remote service desk. This began in April with the Kids Department staffing fewer remote shifts in order to be able to staff their public floor which is growing progressively busier. The big shift is coming on May 17 as we will no longer have any Adult Services staff providing public service from outside of the building at that point. June 2 will be the first day of Adult Services staff working all of their hours in the building.

Patron Interactions

Interactions held steady in April but we saw a slight increase in phone interactions as ADS staff began covering more remote shifts and Kids began to shift their focus to in-person services.

Virtual Meeting Rooms

Virtual meeting room use dipped slightly. We'll see moving forward if this is a trend.

Goodwill Workforce Connection, Agency of the Month

This month's social service display ties in with the program, Selling Your Transferrable Skills that happened on May 5th.



Creative Studios

The Creative Studio had 6 reservations after its soft opening in April. We've already seen more appointments than that in May and plan to begin accepting walkups, not just reservations, in June.

Teen Area

The Teen Area opened on April 19th. We've had numerous teens show up since then, including old and new faces. We have not, however, hit our initial capacity limit of 10 teens in the space.

Study Rooms

Demand for study rooms started to pick up in April and continues to grow rapidly. Mask restrictions were lifted from study rooms at the beginning of May.

KIDS' LIBRARY DEPT REPORT

April 2021

The Kids' Library continues to be hard at work finalizing preparations for the 2021 Summer Reading Program (theme: Tails and Tales). Staff have been working on decorations (multiple biomes of the world will be given their own space to showcase the animals of that region), filming book talks for the schools and a puppet show for the preschools, and finalizing prizes (we're excited to offer more experiential opportunities to participants this year). As COVID-19 vaccines continue to be made readily available and as the state prepares to enter Restore IL Phase 5 this summer, we hope for and anticipate a busy summer being ahead of us. We're also looking forward to welcoming two new members to the Kids' Library this summer as we restart the hiring process after this past year's pause.

Nuala Maloney-Murphy, Michael Speers, Ruth Ronnau, and **Shaira Rock** all did an excellent job of staying calm and accommodating for the patrons who entered into lockdown with staff on Wednesday, April 28.

Linnea Dolan and **Shaira Rock**, with the assistance of **K Donohue**, created three captivating large displays for the department in April: "Don't Bug Me; I'm Reading", "Poetry/Poetree", and "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle." The latter consisted of items that can be recycled but aren't always, such as plastic grocery bags.

Programs

Allison Davis received compliments from a patron regarding her fun Tiny Musicians! program series, specifically the video on flutes. Staff have also complimented Allison on a job well done, mentioning how enjoyable the program is for adults and how Allison is able to provide a broader world and cultural view when she discusses the instrument.

Middle School programming continues to pick up. Alea Perez hosted a STEM-based puzzle challenge for the program Race to the Finish, in which participants were tasked with solving puzzles in order to move closer to the end. In all, 4 participants were active, with one going so far as to respond in rhyming verse, mimicking the puzzles they were tasked with solving.

Dia! (Diversity in Action) celebrated its 25th anniversary this year and **Gloria Walsh-Rock** and **K Donohue** helped ring it in by kicking off our monthly series on titles featuring characters from various marginalized groups.

School, Scouts, & Community Outreach

School – Shaira Rock and Ruth Ronnau crafted an innovative and engaging book talk concept for Middle School students featuring a cast of fictional characters using TikTok to talk about books they enjoyed and have drafted the assistance of numerous Kids' staff to help make it a reality. We can't wait to share it with students soon!

Outreach – Early Childhood Services Librarian Katie Stringwell had **3 virtual visits** with Bethel Early Learning Center, taking place on April 12th, 13th, and 16th. During these visits, she saw 62 three-, four-, and five-year-olds.




