School, Scouts, & Community Outreach

It was a busy month for school services. At the **Lincoln Elementary School Kindergarten Screenings**, children got to choose an EPL pencil and their caregivers received information about homework help resources, special collections, culture passes, creative space as well as a list of fall programs. At the **Elmhurst Resource Coalition Back to School Fair**, Shaira Rock and Heather Forster Jensen handed out free books, EPL bags, pencils, crayons, and stickers to 400 people in attendance. They also brought along the bilingual Spanish-English handouts about the Kids' Library. 




Community Connection: StoryWalk


