Programs

Families enjoyed a wide variety of programs this month including the Polar Express T-Trak train display, New Year's Eve Science Spectacular, drop-in movies, holiday crafts around the world, Marble Snowflake Art, and a 3-day Art Camp. Some particular successes were the Lego WeDo Coding class with 100% attendance, the Festivals of Light storytimes, and the 3-day Art Camp.

Each week the preschoolers learned about a different celebration such as Winter Solstice, Bodhi Day, Hanukkah, Christmas, and Kwanzaa. Since our Christmas storytime occurred the same day as the winter storm, not many families were able to attend. School, Scouts, & Community Outreach

Elmhurst preschools, elementary schools, and middle schools all received a promotional Winter Reading Program video, which included a variety of recommended reads. 
