Programs

This month Winter Reading was in full swing. Readers and listeners came to the Help Desk for their well-deserved prizes, including a chance to win a raffle prize (see below).





Passive programming included drop-in "Snow Fun" activities and a winter sensory bingo to be completed at home. Callie Romenesko's snow science was a favorite. The children created a sled from a cardboard tube; weighed down the sled with different items such as cotton balls, binder clips, and erasers; and tested the speed of their sleds by racing them down a rain gutter.

Virtual programming included a cozy fort storytime where children could listen to stories from the comfort of their





New Fume Extractor

The fume extractor pairs with the laser engraver. It extracts and filters smoke and particles produced during normal use of the laser. This replaces the original fume extractor purchased in 2017.

- Safer: better seals prevent leakage
- More Energy Efficient: Auto On/Off feature means the extractor runs at full power less frequently
- More Cost Effective: fewer, cheaper, and more efficient filters will save an estimated \$1,425/year
- Filters need to be replaced every 6 months, depending on usage

Makery Makes a Cameo at ALA




