Reaching Outward

Libby Mercado, the Teen Engagement Librarian, attended the Elmhurst Commission on Youth meeting, received a tour of Timothy Christian High and visited York High School and spoke with more than 80 students and faculty at the Back to School Bash. Christi Hawn, the Collections Librarian, networked at a Kiwanis meeting and toured West Chicago Public Library. Hayley Rightnowar, the Inclusive Services Librarian, connected face-to-face with patrons who are homebound while handling deliveries a few times this month. Rachael Mason, the Business Services Specialist, networked with members of the community at weekly Rotary meetings. Jeremy Slayton, Digital Collections Librarian, networked with colleagues at the Electronic Subscription Managers meeting. Bryan Blank attended a quarterly adult services managers networking meeting.

Displays

August displays on the 2nd floor included "Back to School Tips for Adult Students", "Family Fun Month", "Barbenheimer" and "Aquatic Exploration".



Programs

August is a slower month in Kids' Library with the summer reading program being over and school starting up. Although there were less registered programs, there were still many passive and drop-in program options, including the craft table, scavenger hunts, middle school hangout activities, Open Lego Building, and the American Adventures picture drawing display. Some programming highlights included the Preschool Teachers Open House, the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten Graduation Party, and Camp Kinder.

Using daily themes of shapes, colors, and numbers, Camp Kinder gave children a chance to practice the classroom skills they would be expected to have when they start Kindergarten. There were also two pretend field trips to practice lining up and walking quietly. Parents had nice things to say about the program, particularly about the packet staff put together. We even had a patron come up to the desk to tell us that her child wasn't able to make the class, but they've been working on the packet at home. She loved how thorough and in-depth it was.



Outreach



Kids staff also created a "Love Makes a Family" booklist and presented a storytime for Brewpoint's Inclusive Family event on August 12.

Collection and Displays

Work is underway to organize the entire picture book collection by subject areas. Kids staff are working to reclassify the items which will be re-catalogued starting October. We have received good feedback from teachers, parents and other adults who believe the new system will make it easier for everyone to find materials that are just right for them. **Molly Schlecht** has finished creating the new labels, **Charlotte Dorsey** will do the re-cataloging, and **Jameson Smith** will oversee the shifting. We appreciate their help with this project! The glass case featured *American Adventures Month*. Using a template that looked like a blank polaroid photograph, kids were prompted to draw a picture of somewhere they went or somewhere they were going to visit during the month of August. Pictures ranged from local (Lizzadro Museum) to farther afield (Zion National Park). Drawings were posted in the glass case to create a "photo" collage.





Ellison Die Cuts Refresh

This may not look like a big deal but it's a significant change. Available in the Makery are nearly 200 Ellison die cuts for cutting shapes out of paper. Many of which are close to 30 years old. This month, Makery staff collaborated to replace worn out dies, reorganize and re-label each one, and update the list of die cuts that is available on the library website. As a result, the die cuts are easier to find and easier for young children to reach safely.



Makery staff Ana Zulkoski and Bryan Bednarek taught another full session of Makery 101: Sewing Basics. Eight patrons with varying levels of experience learned to use the Makery sewing machines by making

a simple, reusable tote bag.



New Sublimation Display

A new display in the Makery demonstrates the different technologies patrons can use to customize apparel. On display are three different methods and how they work on different colors and types of fabric. This has been a helpful guide for patrons who aren't sure which method is best for their project.



New Project Guides

Makery staff have been busy creating several new instructional guides for a variety of Makery equipment. New guides include Sublimation Puzzles, Sublimation Stickers, and Laser Etched Rubber Stamps. More to come!



Coming Soon

Maker Specialist, Adrian Serrano, set up one of the Makery's old 3D printers as a drop-in station. Until now, the only way to 3D print in the Makery was to submit a file online and wait up to a week for it to be finished. 
