Highlights from December:

In December, we partnered with City Hall and got involved in their *Everyone Counts: Elmhurst* census communication effort. The City asked to use the Library as the backdrop for their "Trusted Voices" video segment. Elmhurst City Manager, D205 Superintendent, Park District Executive Director, and Public Library Director (our very own Mary Beth Harper) gave statements as to why everyone should participate in the census and why it matters. The video will soon air on ElmhurstTV.

Marketing has also been revamping the Library's website. Most recently, the *Create* tab has been completely reworked. Information was edited and reorganized to be clearer and easier to navigate. The drop-down menu now highlights information about the Creative Studio, Makery, and classes pertaining to equipment and software found in those creative areas.

700 copies of this year's *Gift Guide* were printed and distributed. There were 188 visits to the online version, as well as 36 clicks (in the first 24 hours of delivery) on the day the eNewsletter was sent out.


