

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

I'd like to welcome Bill Shanklin to the Board of Trustees. He is replacing Jan Vanek. Bill is a long-time resident of Elmhurst who is very active in the community. Marsha Baker has also been reappointed to the Board, and since Carol Jacobsen was appointed to serve until 2016 when she was initially appointed by former Mayor DiCianni, we have a full Board.

We were down 3% in total circulation over last year. Our people counts were also down. I'm not sure why we are down but we'll keep monitoring the situation. Meeting room usage was also down. It's interesting because several times last month our parking lot was full. On a positive note, I am very excited to report that we have exceeded the kids' summer reading participation levels with a total of 5,047 kids signed up for the program. The 5,000th signup was achieved on Monday at about 3:00 PM. The Kids' Department had been giving us minute by minute updates and when the 5,000th child registered, they threw confetti and presented her with a special certificate and a little bag full of goodies. It was all very exciting!

I visited the Arlington Heights Library a few weeks ago and I will report on my trip at the meeting. As we talked about at the last meeting, I'd like to set up a trip to take a tour of the Arlington Heights Library and the Vernon Area Library in Lincolnshire. Arlington Heights recently renovated their entire adult section and many of their ideas are similar to ours. Vernon Area also completed a renovation and I've heard from several people that it looks great. Please bring your calendars to the meeting so we can look at some dates. If you would prefer to visit on your own, that's fine too. I'll talk about some things that you should be sure to look at.

Several staff members attended the ALA conference. I went down on Monday morning with Sam and Rita and did a quick run through of the exhibits. We saw a few interesting things and were able to talk to several of our regular vendors about new products that will be coming out soon. Spending a half day at the conference was perfect.

The Kids' Department began checking out laptops and iPads to use with the new mediascape. In June, the laptops were checked out 53 times and the iPads were checked out 45 times. The popularity of this new service is not surprising and certainly it is something that will only increase. Digital material checkouts continue to increase also. In June, patrons downloaded 971 songs from Freegal, 470 magazines from Zinio, and a total of 2,715 ebooks. I just downloaded about 10 magazines to my iPad to read while traveling. That saved me about \$50 of impulse purchases in the airport. I'm also not burdened with carrying all those magazines – what a great service!

On June 1, Summer Reading Kickoff Day, kids were entertained by a roving juggler, had their faces painted, and watched four Puppets on the Wilder Side performances. Attendance at these shows was a whopping 116 children and 69 adults. The kids also signed up for summer reading: we registered 894 kids on that one day!

Shaira Rock, our new School Services Librarian, brought the summer reading program to the summer school students at Conrad Fischer School. Each Wednesday morning Shaira registers summer readers and hands out prizes. Then she tells stories. In June, her nine storytelling sessions were attended by 388 students and 14 teachers.

There were four Saturday Special Programs in June. On June 8, The Spoon Man performed magical music for 60 children and 40 adults. On June 15, Illinois Jones and the Raiders of the Lost Books brought Illinois history to life for 15 kids and 7 adults. On June 22, Robert Kikuchi-Yngojo told folk tales from Asia to 26 children and 13 adults. On June 29, our friend Dave DiNaso returned with his reptiles, giving a show for 95 children and 50 adults.

On June 19, we invited kids to come outside with us and "Dig in and Plant Something." A total of 31 kids and 19 adults planted seeds in pots they decorated themselves.

International Mud Day was celebrated in style on June 29. Twenty very gloppy kids used the mud slide, threw mud balls, and enjoyed other muddy fun, after which their 16 adults hosed them off before they entered the Library or their cars.

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Our summer reading programs for Middle Schoolers have been popular. Nine kids were trained as Safe Sitters. Our video game club was popular this month; 18 kids played video games together. 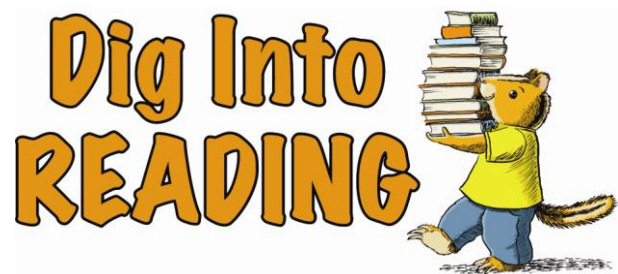
