While our circulation statistics are still down due to the consortium change, our visits to the Library were up this month (a sign of the milder weather), and our meeting room usage is skyrocketing. We've had many positive comments about our meeting rooms. They are extremely useful to the community.

The Even Better @ EPL informational campaign has begun. Pamphlets are available in the Library, the web site has information about the project on it along with a link to the TED talk that we viewed, and staff ambassadors are wearing ASK ME buttons. We are working on an informational kiosk to be placed in the lobby. The kiosk will showcase the renderings, a timeline, and it will house other information about the project as it becomes necessary.

Check out the new streaming video products available to you via the web site. Hoopla has thousands of videos that you can stream. I especially like the BBC section and the documentaries. Indie Flicks provides thousands of award-winning shorts, feature films, and documentaries by independent film makers. My Media Mall/Overdrive provides ebooks, audio books, and video. We are also adding streaming music to our Freegal subscription. Besides being able to download and keep 5 songs per week, patrons will now be able to set up playlists and stream 3 hours of free music per day – no commercials! We'll be offering a class on how to stream video this summer.

The Elmhurst Reads author event will be held on April 24, 7:00 pm at the Hammerschmidt Chapel. The authors will be here from 5:00-6:00 for a reception with staff, Board, Friends members. You are all invited to attend.

Some sessions discussed the usage of technology for elementary school programs including 3D printing, stop motion animation and podcasting and even the usage of smart boards and iPads in storytimes. Other sessions discussed the importance of connecting not only to the patrons, but also to the local schools, community organizations and businesses by attending either meetings or making personal visits to show your readiness to work with them. Finally, several sessions provided untapped opportunities and resources for libraries to use; for example The National Library of Medicine provided quality and unique materials for K-12th grade, like creating an exhibit of the genetics of The Harry Potter world to offer an easier explanation of The Human Genome Project.

Gloria Walsh-Rock presented a hamburger storytime at the Meat Heads store on Sunday, March 23, for nine children. Meat Heads is one of our Winter Reading and Summer Reading program sponsors.

DISPLAYS

Nuala Maloney-Murphy created an interactive display in our entrance case focused on Women's History Month. Using the hints provided, those who could guess the identities of the ten famous women shown received a prize.

Sarah Burnside created a bulletin board that asked children to tell us why they felt lucky. Dozens and dozens of kids wrote their answers.
