Attendance at these shows was a whopping 97 children and 68 adults. We signed up 682 kids for the summer reading program, Fizz, Boom, Read! on that first day.

Club Fun programs began June 13 with Jason Kollum teaching the Science of Balloon Creation to 50 kids over two sessions. Sarah Johnson of the Lizzadro Museum presented Rocks in My Toothpaste on June 20 to 38 participants. The Science of Butterflies drew 32 interested scientists during two sessions.

Family Saturday Specials this month included Crazy Wacky Super Science which was enjoyed by an audience of 89. One hundred fifteen people came to see the Emerald City Theatre's June 21 production of Llama Llama, and 135 people joined in the Big Balloon Odyssey on June 28.

Sharon Karpiel presented the first in a series of Safari Science programs. The June 25 program featured lions and was enjoyed by 26 students. Shaira Rock led the first in a series of a different sort called Blow it Up! On June 18, Diet Pepsi and Mentos erupted to the glee of 75 onlookers.

Other kids programs in June included 2nd and 3rd grade book discussions on June 17 (15 kids) and June 24 (12 kids). The 4th and 5th grade book discussions drew 16 kids on June 16 and four kids on June 30. EPL's first Kids' Chess Tournament on June 6 brought out 24 competitive chess players. Dads and Dominoes was enjoyed by ten kids and dads. Be a Rocket Scientist, a family program on June 28, drew 47 rocketry engineers.

We have 23 program assistants helping with Get Ready, Get Set, Read! and other programs, and 30 Book Buddies reading with second and third graders. Thirteen general assistants come in once a week to shelve, straighten, cut, clean, and generally assist.

The most exciting display in June is always the fabulous raffle prizes displayed in the entrance display case. Kids from grades 2 – 8 earn raffle tickets by reading. This year, we also have an incredible room display, thanks to Darren Pepple and Christian O'Kelley. They created seven robots to decorate the Kids' Library for the summer, and Sarah Burnside added a "mombot" to add a feminine aspect to the group. The minute you walk into the Kids' Library, you know that something special is happening here this summer!
