DIRECTOR'S REPORT

For the fifth year in a row, we received a national ranking in Library Journal's annual review of public libraries. This year 9,305 libraries were rated and only 258 qualified as star libraries. We are rated on visits, circulation, program attendance, and public internet usage. We received four stars out of five stars and placed 17th nationwide and 4th in Illinois in the \$5-9.9 million dollar budget category!

October gives us the first accurate month to month comparison for statistics since leaving SWAN. Checkout statistics are almost exactly the same this month as they were last year in October. Digital materials continue to see the greatest increase each month. Digital materials were 8% of our total checkouts this month. Elmhurst patrons accounted for 88% of all checkouts. Reciprocal borrowers checked out 8%, and various other groups (Elmhurst College Students, Teachers, etc.) checked out 1% or less than 1%.

We've been a standalone library for one year. Looking back on the year, there were some periods of adjustment along with lots of learning. We discovered much about our organization and we are still perfecting processes and fine-tuning the new system. We operate on a more patron driven acquisitions model now. The "suggest a purchase" function took a while for some patrons to get used to but many have discovered what a powerful tool it is. A patron recently remarked that we bought something she suggested and she was the first person to read it. She was very excited about having given us a suggestion and that she was the first person to read the brand new book!

EPL celebrated Halloween with apple cider and apple donuts in the staff lounge. Many staff members dressed up as their favorite book or movie character. There are always some great costumes but my favorite this year was Kelsey O'Kelley who came as an Elmhurst Library card!

Carole Peterson performed her musical magic for a crowd of 150 happy people on October 13. Our Spooky Stories for young kids drew 20 listeners, and Spine Tingling Tales for grade schoolers brought in 25 people. Twentythree students learned to Draw Monsters on October 30, and author Kevin Luthardt visited with a group of 19 attendees on October 11. The Pokemon class drew four kids this month.

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Our Sewing Club was a big hit again this fall. Ten participants learned the basics of sewing; attendance for the three sessions was 29 seamstresses. Our after-hours Murder Mystery program had 37 excited attendees, who did indeed figure out whodunnit. Dinner and a Movie was enjoyed by 20 kids. Ten kids finished the babysitting workshop and were certified as Safe Sitters. IC came to the Library for their annual Science Fair information roundup. Sixty-four students attended. Puppets on the Wilder Side met twice this month with 20 puppeteers attending. Seven players attended the middle school Minecraft program on October 13.

SCHOOL SERVICES
