During one week we asked folks to "Wear Something Seussical" and 135 people got their photos taken and posted on the EPL website and in the Kids' Library. The Science of Seuss on March 14 (also Super Pi day) drew 65 happy Seussical scientists. Thank you to the members of Elmhurst College's Kappa Delta Pi Honor Society for helping with that program.

Staley, the Chicago Bears mascot, visited for "Bear Down on Bullying" on March 26 and drew a crowd of 89 fans. At the March 14 Family Storytime, the student cast of Elmhurst Children's Theater presented songs from Mary Poppins. The March 21 Family Storytime was held at the Elmhurst Art Museum and included "cool car" stories in partnership with the current EAM exhibit and a car craft with the museum staff. On March 28, members of the Kappa Delta Pi honor society assisted during storytime. Partnerships with local groups like these allow us to offer our families a nice variety of storytime and program experiences, which everyone enjoys.

Spring Break for many schools brought lots of activity in the Kids' Library. Open Craft Day on March 30 brought in 130 happy crafters. A class on Sun Print Photography on March 31, held in partnership with the Elmhurst Historical Museum, was attended by fourteen students. The hit of Spring Break was a series of art master classes, presented by Elmhurst Art Museum educator Sarah Johnson, which drew 34 artists in just the two days offered in March. More kids continued to come throughout the week, into April. Thanks to Sarah Johnson and Faith Humphrey-Hill at the EAM. Much of the artwork created during the week will be displayed in early April for an author visit.
