#### Director's Report

We're not exactly sure why, but circulation was up by 13% this month. This is a phenomenal increase. When Orland Park Public Library left the SWAN consortium, they experienced similar increases in circulation. This large increase may be attributed to more of our materials being here for our patrons to check out or, there was an error in SWAN's statistical calculations. Either way, we are happy to see this increase. Usage statistics are very important for assessing our performance. It will be interesting to see what happens in the coming months.

The Library's 10 year anniversary party was a huge success. The Public Information Department did a great job of planning the celebration. Many patrons attended the behind the scenes Library tours and the Friday afternoon reception was well attended. Several of our Elmhurst dignitaries stopped by as well as current and former Trustees and staff. I heard positive comments from many who attended the reception. It really was a wonderful afternoon.

The audio-visual upgrade work began on the morning of the 7<sup>th</sup>. It's very exciting to see this project finally being implemented. I can't wait to see how we will use the technology. I have challenged staff to be thinking of ways to use the Mondopads for programming. When the project is complete, we will schedule informational sessions for staff and patrons to learn about the new equipment.

When you receive your newsletter next month, you will see a new program subject heading. We are hosting several "club" meetings at the Library. Clubs are meant to encourage hobby enthusiasts to meet and share ideas. This expands upon our community center/collaborative learning space/creative workspace idea. Right now, we're hosting an open knitting group, card making group, Italian conversation and culture group, and a recipe sharing group. We hope to have more ideas and more clubs meeting here soon. Let me know if you have an idea! We also included a new section on our statistical report. Please notice the Program Attendance section. While both Kids' and ADS were reporting their program attendance in their department reports, the overall program attendance rates will be more accessible in the main report. We will also be able to compare to previous years.



#### Kristin Sanderson Outreach and Assistive Technology Librarian

One of my favorite things about my role as Outreach and Assistive Technology Librarian is that it gives me a chance to get to know patrons on a more personal level and provide service that really fits their needs. More than one hundred Elmhurst patrons receive delivery and pick-up service due to a long-term illness, disability or advanced age. The last thing people should be worried about when they are ill or in the hospital is how they are going to get their library books back on time. I'm very proud to be part of an organization that goes above and beyond to help people in times of need, and displays compassion for those who are experiencing difficult circumstances.

This service is made possible by my amazing team of six volunteers who donate several hours per month to bring the library to people who can't get here on their own. This model is not just about saving staff time. It's about connecting people with their neighbors. Through this service, we are advancing our vision statement of "providing support and resources" for Elmhurst residents to "gather and interact with each other," something that our homebound patrons have little chance to do. We are also giving people a chance to help out in their community in a meaningful way.

In addition to the homebound delivery program, we provide myriad technology resources for patrons with a variety of disabilities. This year we have improved on our offerings by upgrading the software on our assistive computers that help those with vision or other physical disabilities, and by acquiring four iPads with assistive apps. I enjoyed the opportunity to launch this service and have learned a lot about by talking with patrons. So far, I have worked with a senior citizen "early adopter" who has been using an iPad to help other residents in his retirement community who have low vision learn how to download ebooks. I have also been talking with parents of kids who have autism to learn how they are using the devices. Patrons are thrilled when they learn this service is available, and I'm excited that word is getting around.

Fall Fun was a bit hit this month, with 16 sessions drawing 725 happy listeners, kids and grown-ups alike. Musician Laura Doherty presented a concert for kids on September 14 that was enjoyed by 45 people, and she donated two CDs to our collection. Her songs are perfect for our storytimes! Twenty-two kids learned how to act and talk like a pirate with Kevin Adaire on "Talk Like a Pirate Day," September 19. Chess Club brought in 11 kids this month. LEGO builders numbered 15 this month. They created scenes and posed for photos that were PhotoShopped into their LEGO scene. The "LEGO-size Me" pictures are on our website and each participant got a copy. Open LEGO drew 37 builders this month.

Four students attended the Book Discussion for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> graders on September 17 to discuss *White Fur Flying* by Patricia MacLachlan. This month 33 grade school students came to play Minecraft on our computers and with their own devices. Neil Bonk and Billy Basso are working with us on this complicated but wildly popular program. By next month, we think the glitches will be ironed out.

We began a four-week session called "Be a Magician" on September 26. John Hausheer and other members of the Society of American Magicians in Elmhurst lead this program which teaches kids magic tricks. Ten students attended the first session, and they learned some fabulous tricks to share!
