January was a month of extreme weather episodes. From snow to cold, we were hit over and over with bad weather. Many neighboring libraries closed on record cold days. We did not. We are a designated warming center for DuPage County. Although visits to the Library on the cold and snowy days were much lower than normal, we still had people here. Hearty EPL staff members were ready and waiting to serve patrons. The Kids' Department set up an impromptu open Lego building workshop in the storyroom along with games and crafts to keep kids busy. We're all hoping that the weather stabilizes and people are able to venture out more. One interesting statistic to note is the increase in holds picked up at the drive-up. Patrons are happy to be able to pick up items without having to leave the comfort of their warm cars.

The new magazine format of Fine Print will debut the first week of March. I'm very pleased with the improvements. I think it's going to make a big difference that the newsletter will not arrive folded. The newsletter also highlights services, collections and even includes a few special interest articles. The newsletter will be an even greater marketing tool than it is currently.

Check out the display case at the top of the stairs in the ADS Department. ADS Librarian Rita Perona arranged for Chicago based artist Dana Major to create an original piece of art work to be displayed until the end of March. The display was arranged in collaboration with the Elmhurst Art Museum. This satellite exhibit goes hand in hand with the current museum exhibition.

The new year started with a bang! Lots of snow and lots of kids here at EPL. When area schools closed for four days this month, EPL stayed open and the Kids' Library was hopping. We provided many ways to pass the time – board games, puppetry, LEGOs, crafts, and of course, lots of books! Many kids spent time on the computers, and they also enjoyed playing with the new Mondoboard in the Storytime Room. Staff also gave away buttons that said "I thawed out at EPL." Many families voiced their appreciation for being able to while away the snowy days here.

January premiered the new Chicka Chicka Baby drop-in program for infants and caregivers. Sarah Burnside enjoyed teaching nursery rhymes and songs to eager caregivers under the Alphabet Tree in the picture book area. Participants enjoyed sitting together and socializing after the sessions. This will be a nice complement to the more intimate setting for The Littlest Storytime in our Storytime Room.

On January 4, Judy Ekblad returned to help present a Carl Sandburg Storytime in partnership with the Elmhurst Art Musuem, which was enjoyed by 29 attendees. On January 25, thirty-nine folks joined Sarah Burnside and Gloria Walsh-Rock at the Elmhurst Art Museum for stories that highlighted the Museum's "Spotlight" exhibit. Thanks to Faith Hill of the Museum for providing the craft for this program.

As part of our Winter Reading Program, 25 kids joined in a Beach Party Luau on January 20. The Barefoot Hawaiians packed the house on January 31, bringing in 150 people wanting to forget the snow outside. Storyteller Linda Gorham performed for families on Martin Luther King, Jr. Day for 52 attendees.

Seraya Fulton began a new series, Be a Picture Book Artist, for kids ages 6 – 9. Thirteen kids enjoyed reading a story and creating art based on the illustrations. This monthly program will run through April. Junior Scientists brought in 15 young scientists in grades K-2 who enjoyed making "elephant toothpaste" and "oobleck," and 20 students in grades 3 – 5 enjoyed making their own rubber balls in Freaky Friday Science. Five students attended Chess Club this month.

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The most popular middle school program this month was the Stencyl Program hosted by York High School student, Ajay Jain. Fifty-two kids enjoyed making their own games using the Stencyl program, at this four-week class. Another highlight was the Iron Chef program. Twenty-four kids loved creating treats with chocolate. The MyZone area displayed humorous books during the month of January. The Puppets on the Wilder Side met twice, with a total attendance of 17 puppeteers.

SCHOOL SERVICES

In January the Library was visited by nine first grade classes. The kids were congratulated on learning how to read, played reading games, and watched a puppet show that celebrated reading. Twenty-nine teachers and

parents from five schools brought a total of 332 first graders on these field trips to the Library. Sarah Burnside visited the Buttons and Bows Preschool four times this month, and presented a storytime to a total of 58 children and twelve teachers.


