

Q1 How often do you visit the Library?



Q2 Have you ever found it difficult to find a place to park in the Library's parking lot?



Q3 If you did not find a place to park in the Library's parking lot, where did you park?



Q4 If you did not find a place to park in the Library's parking lot, did you forego your trip to the Library?



Q5 Are there certain times that you do not use the Library because the lot is usually full?



Q6 On average, how long do you stay at the Library?



Q7 On average, how many people come with you to the Library?



Q8 Do you use the drive-up window?




Q9 During the warmer months, do you walk or ride your bike to the Library?



30 min parking spaces would be good!

30 minute spots would be a great idea. Please do not build a parking garage.

acquire lot east of parking lot convert to parking add sheltered walkways

Although the lot is sometimes full, I've never needed to park more than a block away. It isn't a problem. If there is a contemplation of spending money to enlarge the parking lot, I vote no.

arrange with museum to allow people to park there when library lot is full

Can usually find a parking spot...but there have been a few occasions where it was full. Maybe 3 times per year when I couldn't get a spot.

clarify if we can use art museum parking lot

Covered parking would be great. Most of our trips to the library are during the winter for the children's area.

do not take up more green space for parking, pick up window to close to drop off drive up window filled with parked cars and vans

Elmhurst needs more free public parking available south of the train tracks. Except for the one parking garage -- which has very few spots available for non-permit parking and these require payment -- there are very few parking options.

even when its is crowded and i'm driving there are usually spots farther away but I probably not driving there during the busiest times

Get some cameras in the lot, please. My car was hit in the lot.

Hopefully a solution to the parking problem can be found.

I am beginning to believe that people not patronizing the library are parking in its lot, such as those who take the train and don't want to pay the daily parking fee. I wonder if you have signs posted stipulating "Library Parking Only"? Because my ability to walk any distance is limited, I have gotten to the point where I dread having to find a parking spot.

I am glad that the library is so popular, but it is very frustrating on us consumers when there is no parking available in the lot. Also, drive up window is too close to drop off boxes-a lot of congestion there when someone is at the window!

I applaud you for looking for some feedback regarding the library parking lot. It is a hazard. Big cars, little kids; fast-moving, distracted drivers not focusing on where they are driving. In addition, many, many drivers use the north side of the lot to simply bypass other roads and shortcut -- also creating a safety hazard. Diagonal parking would lose a few spots but it might make the lot safer. Thank you, EPL! I attend many wonderful classes at EPL, often several times a week. I arrive very early, just to be sure there is parking. Sometimes I park down near the playground in Wilder Park. That makes it difficult when I check out several heavy books though. Thanks for checking on the parking issue!

I attened many wonderful classes at epl. i always arrive early because i know parking is so tight I come early on Monday Mornings and park. I use the drive up window at different times and don't park. I go to classes on Saturday when parking is fuller but I've found a spot.

I do find parking extremly frustrating. The lot is typically full when i bring my son for groups and to check out books. we often have to circle the lot multiple times and wait for someone to leave. Also there have been times we have changed plans and went to do another activity.

I think the book drop off is in a bad location. If there's a car at the drive-up window, you need to wait until they're done to drop off your books or get out of your car and walk up to the book drop off. Seems like that was poorly planned.

I think the parking is okay most of the time, except on busy days when there are big events going on there. I think overall that the parking is fine, nothing major. Thanks.

i use the drive up window

I usually walk to the library, all seasons. If I drive, I always find a parking space. I go about every other week. I only use the drive up to drop off materials, not for pick ups which seems incredibly lazy to me. I wish there was some way to reconfigure the traffic flow. The lane for materials drop off/pickup gets backed up, people try to pass on the right, and someone will eventually get hurt trying to exit the library and cross east to the lot. I am very grateful for the handicapped parking so close to the door. When it is full I can usually find a regular spot, but if not, I return home. Through traffic between Prospect and Cottage Hill is another issue to address as well. Thank you for asking for opinions and observations. If I can't find parking in the lot, I often turn to nearby side streets to seek parking. In the warmer months I often park in one of the Wilder Park lots for a combo trip to the playground and library.

I'm not advocating more parking space, but college teachers and students and library employees should not take up the nearby spaces, all day, especially in winter. I'd be pleased if there were a 2-hr limit to discourage people who leave their car there all day and may not even be there. Or, have 1-hr limit on the close up spots and 3 hrs at the farther lot. City stickers required, except for a few visitor spots. Thanks for looking into this!

Instead of making all the indoor improvements, a parking structure at the back of the lot would have been much more welcome. I come to the library two or three times a week, but when the children's programs are going on, I'm lucky to find a place to park even in the art museum lot. Sometimes I have to park on the street. I don't see the logic in getting rid of books and trying to bring more people into the library when there's nowhere for all these new patrons to park.

The library is a destination for our family, we are there at all times of the day and evening. Yes, parking is an issue, but as long as we can use the Art Museum cover the overflow I am fine.

The parking by the Art Museum that's connected to the main lot... it's not clear if that is OK or not. If it's not, you (or the art museum) might want to put up some signs.

The parking lot is definitely too small for the volume of traffic it gets. Things get even worse when people start pulling up to the entrance near the drive up window and stopping there to let passengers in and out even when there is a sign clearly saying No Stopping or Standing and there is a perfectly good drop off point at the opposite entrance. This is a pet peeve of mine. It blocks traffic leaving the drive up, worries moms with little kids and older people never know when to go or wait.

The parking spaces are very small and the aisles are tight. It is difficult to get in and out of spaces when other cars are in the aisle waiting to drive by. I have bumped into another car trying to get into a spot (and I notified the owner). But we love the library, it is the best for me and my young children!!!!! The thought of possibly not finding parking does make me hesitate to sign up for events.

There are a few blind corners within the library parking lot that make for difficult driving (e.g. the stop sign on the west side of the lot). Would it be possible to install some of those convex safety mirrors to allow drivers to see around these blind corners and make for a safer driving experience?

There are times that the drop off/return is too long wait due to drive up window

There's no way to improve this physically, but the pickup window and the drop off slots are too close together.

To question 7, sometimes I also come alone, though I sometimes come with one other person, as I indicated. Not finding a parking place only happened to me once. If I see the lot is full I come back later after doing other errands. I admit I also do more on line than I used to.

When considering expansion of parking, I recommend adding a parking garage instead of paving over more green space. Fill the remaining green space with native plants/rain garden to eliminate storm water runoff from paved/impervious surfaces. This strategy needs to be a part of Elmhurst development moving forward. See Villa Park Police Station site and building as a model example of municipal planning for runoff reduction.

When there is an event at the Art Museum, it is not possible to park at the library.

While parking is a problem at the library, this tells you how valuable the library is to Elmhurst.

Yes more parking is needed but then so are more interior seats. If you can find parking (and that is a big IF) you often have a hard time finding a desk to work at. The Park District should give up the wasted space at the northeast corner of the parking lot to be used as a parking lot for both the museum & library - but then you are getting into long walking distances. Since there are so many parking garages going up in Elmhurst it would be nice to see a combined Commuter/Library/Museum parking deck with a top level garden/park. But really, the whole office bldg & Post office setup needs to be rethought - maybe a new village hall (they don't have enough parking either)!
