





Services for Seniors:

We provide services to seniors throughout the community! When aging adults are unable to get to the Library, EPL meets them where they are with visits to independent living and healthcare facilities in Elmhurst.

Our knowledgeable staff provide book discussions, crafts, tech help, and memory care programming.

The Library cares about our community. Within and beyond our walls, EPL strives to make entertainment, engaging stories, and reliable educational materials readily accessible to all.




- Tech Help: Older adults can get assistance setting up email accounts or managing passwords on their personal devices. Librarians also demonstrate online resources available through EPL like databases and library apps for reading eBooks or eAudiobooks, and streaming entertainment like movies and music.
- Avoiding Scams: At in-person visits or via phone or chat, librarians can help older adults avoid scams by identifying suspicious phone calls or dubious emails.
- Disabilities or Homebound: Any person who is temporarily or permanently unable to come to the Library because of illness, disability, or other factors who lives within the City of Elmhurst (and has an EPL card in good standing) is eligible for home delivery service. Librarians also help qualifying adults get set up with the Illinois Talking Book and Braille Service, which provides Braille and audio devices or an app.
- Collections: EPL provides traveling library collections to some facilities, supplying residents with an array of large print books to borrow.


