


- ☐ Check the Libraries and Archives
  - WorldCat & Archivegrid
  - o Newberry & Allen County
  - o archive.org
  - Local State, County, Township & City Libraries
- ☐ Check the Historical Societies & Museums
  - o obituary, photo, & newspaper collections, family files, family & local genealogies, local histories, a local historian etc.
- ☐ Check Other Societies such as DAR & other lineage groups, Railroad Workers Union and other corporate & union archives, Masons and other religious and cultural groups. Work your way down through National, District, State, Region to Local offices.
- ☐ Check the Government Offices
- ☑ Gather → the information for current contacts and accessing collections.
- Online searchable databases national, state, county, township, city historical and vital record sites
- National, State, County, Township & City Libraries, Historical, Lineage, Religious & Cultural Societies, Offices, Archives, Universities – (Feel free to download *Visiting an Ancestor* log from my website.)
- ☑ Call → Do your research about the place before you call. Then, tailor your call to the person in the place you are calling i.e. the clerk, librarian, sexton. Do not ask about a specific ancestor unless the person asks you for a name. Ask about the records or collection of records. This is about finding collections not ancestors, yet. (Feel free to download *Calling for Records* log on my website.)
- ☑ Mail → Watch the payment method.





compare and create other lifespan timelines for family members


Please keep in mind, the federal government had a census every 10 years starting with the 1790 tax list, but many states, counties, schools, territories and other factors in U.S. history completed census. But start with the state and federal censuses.

Ancestry.com – free if you are in your public library

FamilySearch.org – free once you register

HeritageQuest.org – remote access through your public library

City Directories were created in many large and smaller cities. You can find these in many databases but start with the big two: Ancestry.com and FamilySearch.org
