COMING SOON



Shifts in society are changing the way you use your Library. EPL is still the place to introduce your kids to reading or to discover the latest bestseller, but now you and your family are learning technology skills in computer classes, using the Makery and 2nd floor spaces to create, and discovering new resources in the Library of Extraordinary Things.

Over the next year, we are updating the Kids' Library to better accommodate your growing needs, including:

A larger Learning Garden:

For caregivers and kids up to age 6, this space includes toys and furniture to encourage learning and literacy.

A computer lab in the Kids' Library:

Kids can learn emerging tech skills in a familiar atmosphere.

A dedicated middle school space:

This space encourages middle school students to study, socialize, and explore while keeping noise at a minimum.

Portions of the Kids' Library may be blocked off as phases are completed, but at no time will the entire space be closed.

A recent project by Elmhurst resident and business owner Melissa Villanueva used the Makery's laser cutter, equipment that may seem hard to master. Don't be intimidated! Read along to learn how to create your own custom wood carving.

First, create an image to engrave using your preferred image editing software. The image can be words, a pattern, or a logo. If just words, you can create it with Microsoft Word. If using a photograph, digitally convert it to a line drawing or a single color image. (Pro Tip: EPL offers classes on this! See "Laser Cutter" on page 12.)

Next, bring the file (saved on a USB drive) along with a piece of wood (the one pictured is 10 x 12 inches and 3/4inch thick) to the Makery. Staff upload the image file into the laser cutter software. After that, it's up to the laser to work its magic. Less than 60 minutes later, you have the finished piece seen on the cover.

Luckily, the first try turned out great, but that's not always the case. Allow yourself enough time and backup material in case your first attempt doesn't go as planned. Bring extra supplies!
