## Artist Revisits Allerton

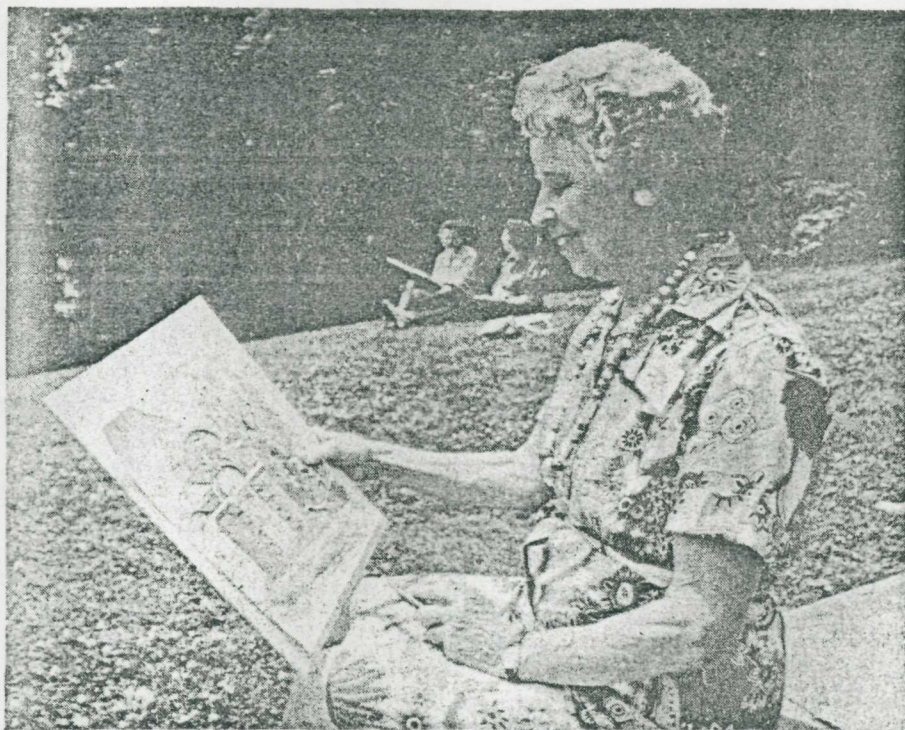

Hildegard enjoys reminiscing over the time spent these past six summers, while participating in the Adventures of Art program, University of Illinois division of Allerton Park, Monticello.

This year Hildegard was asked to do two demonstration paintings for advance students. Dr. Walter Johnson, who heads the Adventures in Art Program, plans many lovely experiences for the Adventurers. There are beginning and advanced classes held both morning and afternoon, also, lectures and demonstrations on perspective, color and figure and slides of the old masters and current art.

Mrs. Horn is but one of the many artists who study and paint in Allerton Park. She is a graduate of the Chicago Art Institute and studied one year at Chicago Academy of Fine Arts. She has studied under many fine artists and teachers, including Arnold Turtles and Mrs. Van Sickle Ford.
