Robert T. Palmer 1915-1989

Robert Palmer's long and distinguished career, spanned 30 years as Elmhurst's first city manager. During the period of the City's major expansion 1953 to 1983.— Palmer was responsible for many major projects: the change from a volunteer to a full-time fire department, the development of the sewer separation program, the construction of the Elmhurst underpass, development of the Industrial area and the Schiller Street and North and South York fire stations.

Palmer was also one of the early members of the DuPage Water Commission which campaigned for many years to bring Lake Michigan water to the western suburbs — a project now under construction.

Mr. Palmer died in February 1989.
