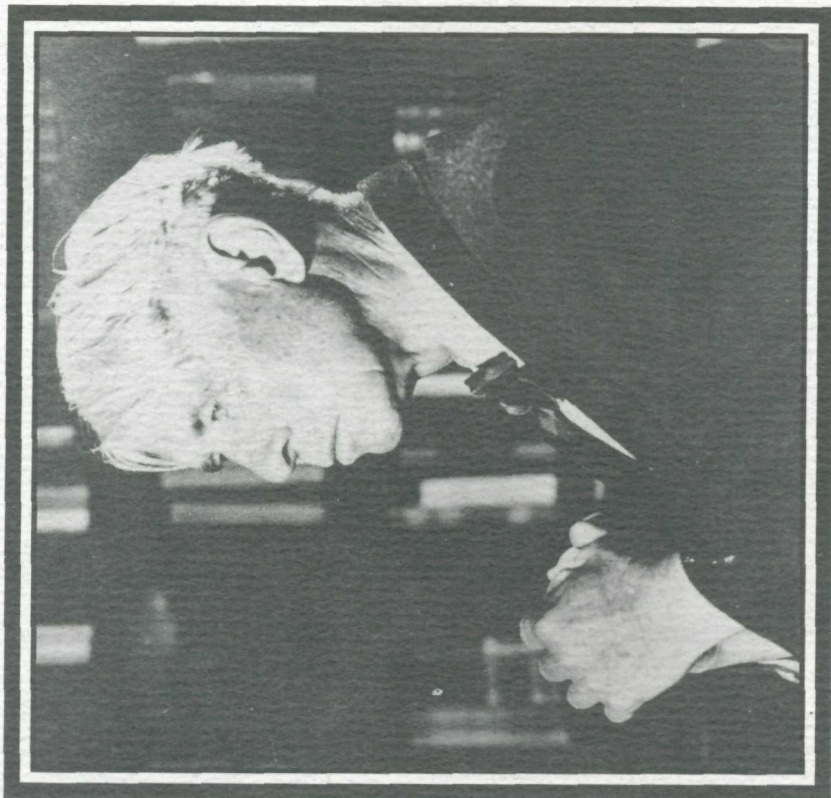

**Carl Sandburg 1878-1967**

Renowned American poet, author and historian, Carl Sandburg, lived in Elmhurst for 11 years. He and his family first moved to Elmhurst in 1919.

The Sandburg house, no longer standing, was located at 331 S. York St. While living in Elmhurst, Sandburg wrote: *Rootabaga Stories*, *Rootabaga Pigeons*, *Abraham Lincoln: The Prairie Years*, *The American Songbag*, *Good Morning, America* and *Abe Lincoln Grows Up*.

Sandburg received numerous awards for his writing including the Poetry Society of America medal, the American Academy of Arts and Letters' gold medal for historical and biographical writing (he also was elected to membership in that organization in 1940), the Albert Einstein Award of Yeshiva College and honorary doctorates from some 34 colleges.

In 1960, Elmhurst Jr. High School was re-dedicated and renamed Sandburg Jr. High in his honor. Sandburg died in 1967.
