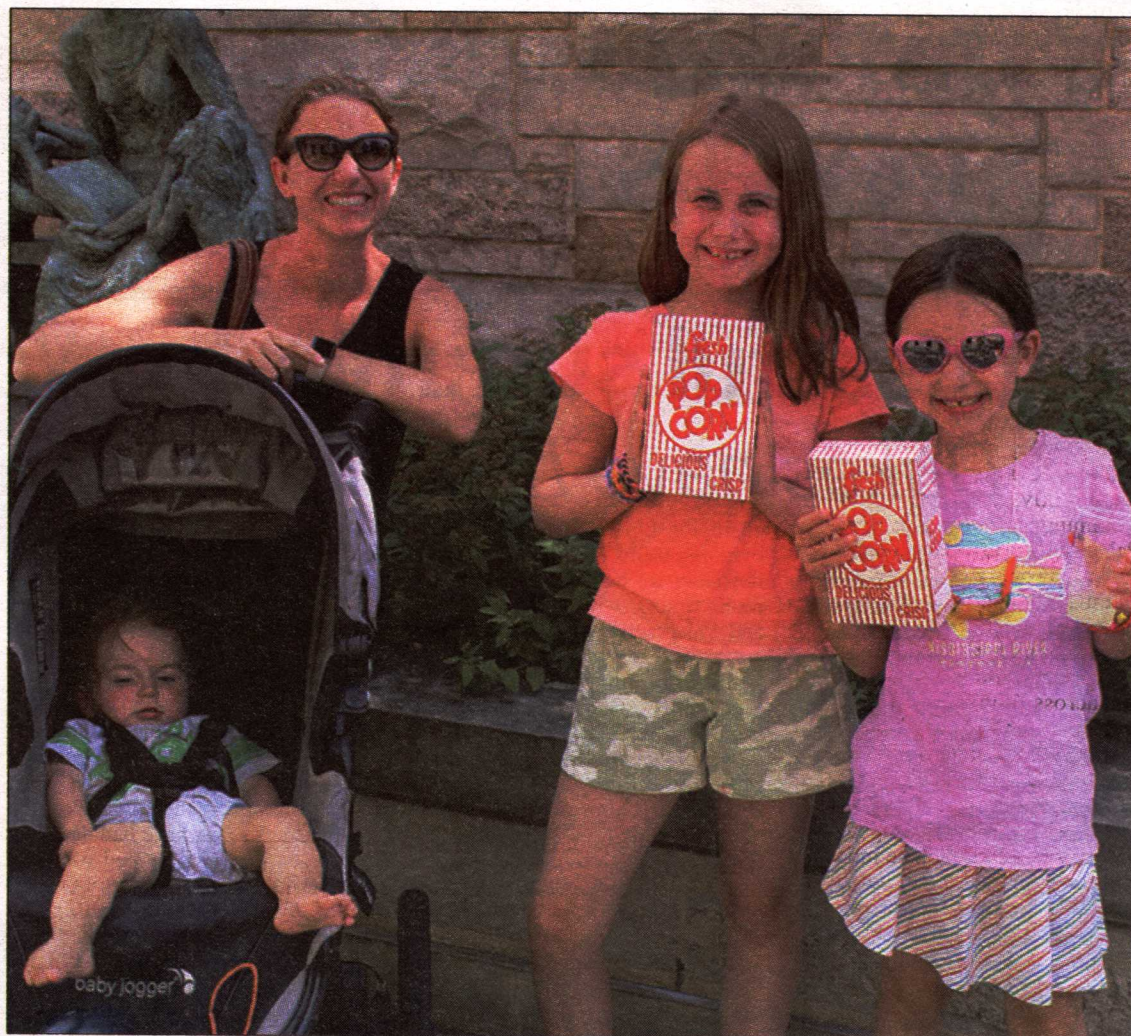
Spin and win

YORK BOYS AND GIRLS VOLLEYBALL TEAM

Both the York boys and girls volleyball teams are the recipients of the 2021-2022 United States Marine Corps/American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award. The award is given out to high school teams that have a cumulative year-long GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale or 4.1 on a 5.0 scale. This was the York girls' fifth award in a row and the Dukes boys team's sixth overall award. The York boys team also ranked in the top 20 percent of GPAs for all teams that earned the award in the boys high school division. The award celebrated its 30th year this past school year.
