

Twitter Terms


- **DM** (**Direct Message**): private conversation with a follower.
- Favorite: To favorite a Tweet means to mark it as one of your favorites by clicking the yellow star next to the message. They are most commonly used when users like a Tweet.
- **Follow:** To follow someone on Twitter is to subscribe to their Tweets or updates on the site.
- **Follower**: A follower is another Twitter user who has followed you.
- Hashtag (#): Using hashtags to categorize Tweets by keyword
 - People use the hashtag symbol # before a relevant keyword or phrase (no spaces) in their Tweet to categorize those Tweets and help them show more easily in Twitter Search.
 - Clicking on a hashtagged word in any message shows you all other Tweets marked with that keyword.
- Mention: Mentioning another user in your Tweet by including the @ sign followed directly by their username is called a "mention." Also refers to Tweets in which your username was included.
- **@reply**: Any update posted by clicking the Reply button on a Tweet.
- **Retweet (verb)**: To retweet, retweeting, retweeted. The act of forwarding another user's Tweet to all of your followers.
- **Trend:** A subject algorithmically determined to be one of the most popular on Twitter at the moment.
- Tweet (verb): Tweet, tweeting, tweeted. The act of posting a message, often called a "Tweet," on Twitter.
- **Tweet (noun)**: A message posted via Twitter containing 140 characters or fewer.
- Verification: A process whereby a Twitter account receives a blue check icon to indicate that the creator of these Tweets is a legitimate source.

Getting your Twitter Account

- I suggest signing up for an account on a computer and downloading the app onto your personal device later!
- Navigate to Twitter.com and click on "Sign-up"
- Fill out the prompts and click sign up! It will let you know if your password is not strong enough.
- It may ask you to secure your account with an additional email or phone number but you can choose to skip that step
- Next you will come up with your "handle" or "username."
 - It can be a max of 15 characters
 - You must have a unique username that is not currently in use (it will tell you if a name is taken)
 - You will use this info to sign into your account
- After you create your name, you can select topic you're interested in to help customize your experience
- For topics not listed, you can search for them in the section titled "Looking For Even More?"
- Then you will have the option to select suggested accounts to follow or to search for names you might want to follow.
 - You do not have to "follow" someone to see their tweets. This is to help shape the Tweets you see when you log in.
- It will ask you whether you want notifications
- To access all of Twitter, you'll need to check your email to confirm your email address
- Now that you have a username and password, you can download the app from your app store and sign in with your new credentials!
